Thanks to each volunteer Rotarian who (masked and gloved) prepared and served lunch at MUST Ministry dining facilities this past Thursday. Once more, the crew headed by Chef **Harold Hobbs** cooked and served hot lunch to 60+ diners. Thirty box lunches were prepared, delivered to the front gate by the Army National Guard, and another thirty diners were served in the dining hall. Assisting in cooking and preparation were PE **Will Allen**, Adam Hobbs, **Andrew Hairetis**, **Jim Trapnell**, and **Marlys Williams**.

Serving was the Rotary team of Dr. **John Knox**, **Andrew Hairetis**, and Jim Trapnell with backup from the cooks.

On the menu today for the entrée was Smoked Sausage Pasta Alfredo consisting of 6 lbs. (or 12 links) of sausage links, 12 one pound boxes of elbow macaroni cooked al dente, 12 quart jars of Alfredo sauce, 8 cans of LeSeur English peas, with parmesan cheese melted on the top. Accompanying the entrée was a tossed salad with Ranch dressing, mixed fruit, assorted breads and cookies and brownies for dessert. Breads and desserts were donated by Publix.

MUST has broken ground for their new facility to be constructed across Hwy. 41 on the Field property, and in the near future will be able to quadruple their capacity. There are plans to build a state-of-the-art kitchen and living facility.
