He has been recognized for his contributions to the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International with a Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, Arch Klump Society, Level 4 Foundation benefactor, and is a member of the Bequest Society. His contributions toward the Georgia Rotary Student Program have been recognized with a presentation of a Will Watt Fellow, Hue Thomas Fellow, Kendall Weisiger Fellow and a Ronnie Waller Fellow.


He has served Rotary District 6900 for many years including the 2009 Paul Harris Society Chair, 2010 Major Donor Chair, 2010 RI Montreal Convention Coordinator, 2011 Audit Committee, 2012 – 2014 Assistant Governor, 2013 District Conference Co-Chair and 2012 – 2014 Finance Committee and he was District Governor of District 6900 in 2015-16.

Bob's profession is Nursing and Assisted Living Homes Administration. An Advocate for long-term care for our seniors, he has owned and managed thirty-two nursing and assisted living homes in the southeast employing approximately 2,500 employees. Born in Lake City, Florida and raised in the Atlanta area, Bob has lived in Roswell since 1973. He graduated from Valdosta State University earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminology in 1976 with post graduate studies in Guidance and Counseling. He was a member of the ODK Honor Society and the Kappa Alpha Fraternity. He has served on the Board of Governors at VSU since 1986. He is still an active member of the Alumni Association, a current

Board Member of the VSU Foundation and the Blazer Athletic Board. Bob was the recipient of the Valdosta State University Distinguished Alumni Award for 2015. PDG Bob was recently inducted into the VSU athletic Hall of Fame.

Bob is a long time member of the Roswell United Methodist Church, and is on the Board of Stewards, as well as the Foundation Committee and Vice Chair of the Finance Committee. He has served for 20 years as the Foundation Chair for the "Malone Dodson Golf Tournament".

In honor of the club's 100th birthday, Morgan Robertson delivered the first of several presentations on the history of the Rotary Club of Marietta. He has worked many hours, along with **Buck Northcutt** and Harold Hobbs, to organize and analyze the available materials pertaining to club history. The primary sources are accounts from local newspapers, the original club minute books, the Rotary Buster (the predecessor to the *Rotalight*), thirty club scrapbooks, five previous histories of the club, and archived Rotalights - courtesy of past president **James Eubanks**' hard work.

Jeff Cooper introduced our speaker, Evan Mercer. Evan recently completed his first year at Vanderbilt Medical School. He is a graduate of Harrison High School. No written narrative can do justice to Evan's speech, but he began it by stating that he was "born into a world of silence." His story is one of perseverance which encouraged all of us to summon the courage and fortitude to power through life's difficulties.

As a child, he was not diagnosed with hearing loss until age four, when it was determined he had no hearing in his left ear and very little in his right ear. His elementary school classmates wanted to help him, but he wanted to go beyond needing their help. He wanted to assist them when they encountered a word they did not know or could not pronounce. He was told he could, at best, hope to be a janitor, preferably on the night shift, so he would not have to communicate as much. And so, spurred on by his mother, he began an extraordinary childhood of thousands of hours of extra reading and study to overcome his hearing issues.

Evan's efforts met with much success. He attained the rank of Eagle Scout and then went on to be named the National Eagle Scout of the Year. He graduated first in his class at Harrison High School and was a Commodore Scholar at Vanderbilt earning both neuroscience and communications degrees prior to starting medical school. His was perhaps the most inspiring Rotary speech of my years in Rotary.

The opportunity drawing was administered by **Chris Mitchell** and **Julie O'Meara**. The red marble remained in the bag this week. Julie led the pledge and the four-way test, and then the meeting was adjourned.
