Today's Program Brad Hawkins

Brad A. Hawkins is the Aviation Wing Director of the Marietta Museum of History. He began his career with Marietta Museum of History as a volunteer in 2017 before becoming Aviation Wing Project Wing Coordinator in January 2018. Since January of this year, Brad is the Aviation Wing Director.

Brad holds a Master of Arts degree in History from the University of West Georgia and a Bachelor of Arts also in History with a minor in Georgraphy from Kennesaw State University. He graduated with a 4.0 average from both Universities.


The Aviation Wing is a growing collection of aircraft displayed on a 15-acre campus conveniently located at 555 Perrin Road, Marietta, Georgia just 4.5 miles west of I-75. The museum highlights the impact the aviation industry has had on our local culture. It shows how aviation catapulted our reasonably typical, small, Southern agricultural community into the industrial age and how Cobb County has impacted global events. They also seek to interest America's youth in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) disciplines through exposure to the science and physics of aeronautics and astronautics.

The museum is open Fridays and Saturdays from 10 A.M. until 3 P.M. and Sundays from 1 P.M. until 5 P.M.



Minutes from the September 18 Meeting

Chris Bethel, President of Marietta Rotary, opened this week's meeting with announcements. Wearing many hats today, the Invocation/Prayer for this meeting was offered by **Chris Mitchell**. **Neera Bahl** introduced her guest, Babe Atkins Byrne, a well-known courthouse face. A lifelong friend of **Morgan Robertson**, Tjeerd de Boer from the Netherlands (a/k/a Boo Boo), joined the meeting today as well as cheerfully assisting with the MUST lunch.

Joe Atkins opened Sunshine by proclaiming how fortunate we were to have Babe Atkins join us today. Abbott Hall, after fathering two daughters, and grandfathering three granddaughters, announced the arrival of his very first grandson. Chris Bethel revealed that **Thomas Sherrer** announced his engagement via Facebook. Mary Ansley Southerland welcomed Jim Squire, Governor of Rotary District 6900 and today's speaker.

- President Chris presented the Rotarian of the Month award for September 2019 to Harold Hobbs, for his welldeserved service and leadership for the monthly lunch at MUST Ministries serving as chef, cook, and menu planner.

• In celebration of Public Safety Week, President Chris announced plans for an offsite meeting to serve BBQ lunch to the Marietta Police Department and Marietta Fire Department at the Fire Department between 12:00 and 1:00 pm on October 9 (112 Haynes St. NE, Marietta, GA 30060). There will be a tour of the Fire Department Museum.

Thanks to Harold Hobbs, Buck Northcutt, and Morgan Robertson for sifting through old photographs, photo albums, and newspaper archives to prepare the history presentations in celebration of Marietta Rotary's 100 Year Anniversary. Dispersed around the meeting room were numerous posters depicting well-known faces of Rotarians over the 100-year history of the club. Many descendants of the early founders are current members today. Several current members date back two - four generations – an extraordinary record. Morgan opined Marietta Rotary has historically been comprised of the best the community has to offer including authors, educators, judges, physicians, dentists, bankers, soldiers, rangers, attorneys, and five mayors. A few of the standouts include Fred David, President of University of Georgia, Conley Ingram, Cobb Superior Court Judge, Leo Aikman, Columnist, Lamar Franklin (who had perfect attendance for 50 years), Clarence Crowther, County Agent, Phil Malonson, WWII Fighter Pilot, Dan Worley, Bank President and Partner in Worley and Schillings, Lewis Sohn, Chairman of the Marietta Housing Authority and head of UGA's Alumni Club, Roy Simmons, VP of Public Affairs, Lockheed Georgia, Stinson Adams (BB) who served 25 years as the Sergeant at Arms, Linnie Lou McRae, longtime proofreader for the Rotalight, and Susan Upchurch who served as Secretary for over ten years. Most of the listed names are no longer with us but are still present in our memories.

Assistant District Governor, Mark Barbour, introduced Jim Squire, Governor of District 6900, and described him as the epitome of Service above Self. He is the Rotarian's Rotarian. Governor Squire was presented with a bottle of his favorite beverage. He and Chris Bethel jointly presented two Paul Harris Fellow Awards, one to **Morgan McNeel** and another to Mark Barbour. This Rotary achievement award is bestowed to those of extraordinary

service. Both recipients are repeat winners. For Mark this is the second award, and for Morgan this is a +1 Sapphire award.

Before Jim Squire embarked on today's session, he presented the Lifetime Service award to highly-respected Rotarian, Dr. **John Knox**, celebrating 52 years of Rotary. John Knox joined the club on November 1, 1967. Caught off guard by this bestowment, John was uncharacteristically at a loss for words for a few moments.

DG Jim Squire emphasizes the theme "Connect with Rotary." The reason people stay in Rotary is fellowship. We must make connections for members. Jim confessed he was likely preaching to the choir. He applauded the club for the upcoming effort which will connect citizens in the community with the service of Rotary by assembling and providing a literacy package in tote bags to new parents at WellStar Kennestone. This effort connects the club and supports the district and will provide 2,500 – 5,000 new parents with books and information from Marietta Rotary. Praise to president elect Mary Ansley Southerland and President Chris Bethel for doing the preliminaries and paperwork for obtaining this grant for the club.

October 24 is World Polio day at the CDC. There will be a reception at 5:30 pm at the Center for Disease Control; however if you wish to attend, please contact Chris Bethel as there are several steps to undertake before you will be able to attend and be allowed entrance to the CDC facility.

The Rotary Foundation was founded in Atlanta in 1917. There are Rotary Action Groups (RAGS) for members for specific types of service such as Aids Prevention or Ending Human Trafficking. Additionally, there are Rotary fellowships which are about things people enjoy: tennis, golf, etc.

The final connection is connecting to the world with compassion. The number 1 Rotary internal issue is membership. Though the Rotary external goal is to eradicate polio, the internal goal is to attract and retain members. Ask a friend to join. There are 1.2 million Rotarians in 200 countries worldwide. The two primary reasons members join and then leave are:

- 1. What I experienced was not what I was told beforehand. A strong organization is fundamental and vital.
- 2. I wasn't asked to be involved and lost interest. New Rotarians must be engaged.

Lifelong learning is critical. It is important to be in literacy activities. Jim predicts Marietta Rotary will win awards for

its literacy activities.

Jim presented a straw hat which promoted the District 6900 gathering at Jekyll Island April 30 – May 3, 2020 to PE Mary Ansley Southerland and congratulated her on the phenomenal job she is doing. Jim announced speakers need to do 3 things (1) Be brief (2) Be sincere and (3) Be seated, which he promptly did.

The District Governor is accompanied today by his wife, Donna, who graciously provided printed particulars for the D6900 Conference at Jekyll Island, Georgia April 30 through May 3, 2020. It will include several fun filled evenings e.g., "Taste of the District" (hometown specialties of many of the D6900 clubs so bring your recipes), Jimmy's Fish Camp (featuring Coastal Georgia native DG Jim's local seafood selections), and a Kentucky Derby celebration and welcome for 2020-2021 governor Kirk Driskell (don your Derby hats and accoutrements). 
