

Minutes from the October 2 Meeting

Yours truly was awarded the Rotarian of the Month for September 2019. It is my pleasure and privilege to be the Editor of our award winning Rotalight. This honor is shared with **Abbott Hall** and all of the club members who graciously offer to scribe the minutes throughout the year. Thank you.

Chuck Boring led Sunshine, Past President Jesse stood up first to say that during his family vacation on Fripp Island he strolled into The Chocolate Tree in Beaufort, SC, where he found chocolates in the shape of the Rotary Wheel. He purchased two, one for President Chris and the other for Mark Barbour. Our next sunshiner was Norm Aiken who loudly declared that he is no longer living with two women. That got quite the reaction from the members! Alas, the real story was not nearly as steamy and salacious as one would think – Norm and his wife lived with his wife's sister until their new home was completed. He is now living in his new home with his wife and appears to be very relieved by this turn of events.

In a series of presentations about the history of our club as we celebrate our 100th Anniversary, Morgan Robertson titled this presentation "Starts and Finishes". In 1919 a gentleman named John Hancock approached the then President of the Atlanta Rotary Club, Albert S. "Bert" Adams and proposed the issuance of Rotary's 544th charter to a club in Marietta. On Thursday, October 23rd, 1919, President Adams with 25 other members of the Atlanta Rotary Club, boarded a train to Marietta. Upon arrival they were transported to the Marietta Country Club for a sumptuous meal. The Governor of the 8th Rotary District rose to tell the new club what Rotary stood for, describing the ideal Rotarian, and welcomed the club in the warmest terms to the 8th District. He then swore

in the first elected officers, including John Hancock as President. Bert Adams then gave them the glad hand of friendship, welcomed the club and all its members into International Rotary and presented John Hancock with the charter of the Rotary Club of Marietta.

From that start, followed a century of activity and service. Our club has sponsored scout troops, youth clubs, sporting events, supported schools, charities and the underprivileged. We can be proud of our long and impressive legacy of good turns and good deeds.

Judge Adele Grubbs rose to introduce our speaker. Before she did so, she gave a shout out to Mark and Don Barbour's mom who sings in the choir with Judge Grubbs, calling her a bright light and a smart woman. Judge Grubbs prefaced her introduction by reminding us how Lockheed Martin and Dobbins Air Force Base have profoundly shaped and influenced Cobb County. She then introduced Brad Hawkins, the Director of the Aviation History and Technology Center. Currently the Center has 13 aircraft from various points in time. Once part of the Marietta Museum of History, in 2004 The Aviation and Discovery Center was created and the organization opened to the public in 2015. In 2019 the Center split from the Marietta Museum of History and formed its own 501(c)(3).

Brad broke out the goals for the Center between short and long term. The short-term goals include achieving stability, increasing community awareness and impact, development of facilities, outreach and education. The long-term goal is to build a 25,000 sq. ft. facility to house the aircraft. Brad wants people to know that aviation changed the course of history of Cobb County from an

agricultural community into the industrial age, impacting global events. One example is that in 1961 President John Kennedy met with the CEO of Lockheed Martin to desegregate Lockheed Martin. This occurred three years prior to the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Brad wants people to know this history and aims to educate, engage and inspire those that come the Center. Right now he is raising awareness of the Center and encouraging others to get involved by becoming a member, and other ways to get involved.

The Opportunity Drawing was administered by **Lance Burchett** and **Dan Kirk**. As Dr. John Knox won last week's pot, this week's pot was \$55.00. The first to draw was **Tom Downs** and for the second time in a row we had another winner! Tom will receive \$27.50 for his efforts.

As usual, President Chris told our speaker that as a token of our gratitude we will donate a book to a Marietta school in his name.

President Chris reminded us that we are off-site next Wednesday, serving barbeque to the Marietta Police and Firefighters – please sign-up to serve our local first responders and heroes! The following day is the MUST Ministries Cook and Serve. He reminded us to attend the 100th Anniversary Gala on October 19th and to mark our calendars for Thursday October 24 for our joint luncheon with the Marietta Kiwanis. We were also reminded that we have a new proposed member in Mark Wright. With announcements completed, Chuck Boring led us in the Pledge and 4-Way Test. The bell rang and this informative and entertaining meeting was adjourned.


